

Cynthia Lewis Lagdameo is Counsel for International Antitrust at the Office of International Affairs at the U.S. Federal Trade Commission. Ms. Lagdameo focuses on the work of the International Competition Network, including its working groups on unilateral conduct and mergers.

Prior to joining the Federal Trade Commission in 2007, Ms. Lagdameo was an attorney at the U.S. Department of Justice's Antitrust Division. She was a member of the Foreign Commerce Section from 2002 to 2007, where she coordinated the Section's work on the International Competition Network. From 2000 to 2001, she served on the Telecommunications Task Force, where she worked on merger investigations and was lead staff attorney responsible for advising the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) on whether a Bell Operating Company had met legal requirements designed to open local telecommunications markets to competition. Ms. Lagdameo received the U.S. Department of Justice Attorney General's John Marshall Award for Outstanding Legal Achievement for Providing Legal Advice to the FCC. From 1998 to 2000, Ms. Lagdameo was counsel to the International Competition Policy Advisory Committee, responsible for multijurisdictional merger review issues. Ms. Lagdameo began her career as an attorney at Skadden, Arps, Slate, Meagher & Flom in New York and Brussels.

Ms. Lagdameo obtained her law degree from the Georgetown University Law School, where she graduated magna cum laude. Ms. Lagdameo is an active member of the American Bar Association, serving as a Vice-Chair of the Section of Antitrust Law's International Committee from 2002 to 2007.
