

## **ELIZABETH M.M.Q. FARINA**

Ms. Farina was appointed as the President of the Brazilian Competition Council (CADE) in July 2004. She holds a PhD in Economics from the University of Sao Paulo (1983). In 1990, Ms. Farina received the "**Haralambus Simeonides Award**" from Brazil's National Association of Graduate Programs in Economics (ANPEC).

From 2002 to 2004, she was the Head of the Department of Economics of the University of Sao Paulo and Vice-Coordinator of the university's Food and Agribusiness Program (PENSA) Ms. Farina served as a Graduate Course Coordinator in the Department of Economics and taught Microeconomics and Industrial Organization. She has been the advisor of several theses and dissertations on subjects such as Agribusiness, Regulation, and Competition Policy.

She has also been engaged as a consultant in Brazil and other Latin America countries to provide economic advice in the fields such as the strategies for food and agribusiness, antitrust litigation, and mergers and acquisition analysis. She has participated in congress meetings, symposia and seminars at both the national and international level where she lectured on such themes as Agribusiness Economic Regulation and Antitrust Policy.
