

TERRY CALVANI

Terry Calvani was Commissioner of the US Federal Trade Commission (1983-1990) and was acting Chairman of the Commission during 1985 and 1986. From 1990 until 2002 he was a partner in the antitrust practice group of Pillsbury Winthrop. From 2002 until June 2005, he was a Member (of the board) of the Irish Competition Authority and Director of the Criminal Cartels Division. He also held the mergers portfolio during 2003. Since 2005, Terry has been Of Counsel to the firm and is resident in its Washington, D.C. office.

Following his graduation from the Cornell Law School, where he was Articles Editor of the Law Review, he practiced with the Pillsbury firm. From 1974-1983, Terry was Professor of Law at Vanderbilt School of Law teaching courses on antitrust law. More recently he has taught antitrust law at Duke University School of Law (2000), the Harvard Law School (1998-2001), Trinity College, Dublin (2004-2005), and Cornell Law School (2006).

Terry is the editor of a book and numerous articles on competition law and policy and has lectured extensively on the subject. He has served as chairman of several ABA Antitrust Section committees and two terms on its governing council. He is a member of the American Law Institute, serves on the advisory board of the *Antitrust Bulletin*, and has been a member of the Administrative Conference of the United States.

While in private practice, Mr. Calvani has worked on acquisitions/joint ventures in a very large number of industries and their review by numerous competition agencies. He has participated in civil and criminal investigations in many industries by both federal and state authorities. He has also provided antitrust counseling to a large number of companies and several trade associations.
